ROSARY VOLUNTEERS BEFORE MASSES – With the re-assignment of Deacon Clapp, we will need volunteers to lead the Rosary and Chaplet of Divine Mercy 30 minutes before the weekend Masses. If you are willing to accept this responsibility, please sign up after Masses. Hopefully, we will have a number of volunteers so that we can have a schedule and share the responsibility. Thank you for your prayerful consideration.

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION — We need volunteers to serve in this most sacred ministry during the weekend Masses. Part of this responsibility will include the ability to climb the stairs to the choir loft. In order to serve as an EMHC, the following are the minimal requirements of the Church: a registered, active (attending weekly Mass and receiving Holy Communion in the parish on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation, confessing any mortal sins when needed) member of the Catholic Church and Saint Joseph Parish for at least one year; observing days of Fasting and Abstinence during

the Church's year; providing for the needs of the Church according to your means; have received the Sacrament of Confirmation; living a moral life with regard to your state in life (i.e. married in the Church, not cohabitating or dating if divorced, etc.) so as not to cause scandal among the Faithful; spending some time, not less than 15 minutes, (before Mass or on Fridays or other days) in prayer and adoration before the Most Blessed Sacrament. If you are able to fulfil the responsibilities of this sacred ministry, I invite you to a formation meeting on **Sunday**, 13 July at 6:30PM in the church. Thank you for prayerfully considering giving of your time and talent to this ministry.

ELITE ACOLYTE MINISTRY - I appreciate all of the Altar Servers that assist with the Masses, and I want to continue to allow boys and girls who want to serve at Mass from First Communion through Confirmation to continue to do so. I Always need two well-trained altar servers at Every Mass. I have tried to be patient with servers as I recognize that they are children and do not always remember their responsibilities; however, I am getting to the age where I can no longer be the Master of Ceremonies (overseeing the liturgical work of other ministers) as well as performing my priestly duties. At this time, I am ready to install a new rank of more mature Acolytes who are willing to undergo rigorous training, and who are able to carry out their duties without being prompted by me, as well as overseeing and directing (for example ringing the bells, or ensuring that I have the water and wine, or the incense at the proper time) the younger altar servers during regular and special occasion Liturgies. The newly forming Elite Acolyte Core Ministry is open to young men who have received the Sacrament of Confirmation through the end of 12th grade. They will be the principal altar servers at major liturgical celebrations during the year, and will also be assigned to one of the three weekend Masses each week to act as Master of Ceremonies. This ministry will require great attention to liturgical detail and the ability to make and carry out decisions during Mass in such a way that the priest and congregation are not distracted. This ministry is not for every young man, but is reserved for those who really want to dedicate the spiritual development, study, practice, time and attention necessary to be the invisible sanctuary minister who makes it possible for the rest of the ministers, priest or bishop included, to carry out our ministry seamlessly. In order to become part of this ministry, you will be required to attend a monthly, Sunday evening, one and onehalf hour study, training and spiritual formation practicum with me, assisted by a safe environment qualified adult. Next week I will have a sign-up list available for the brave young men, who are Confirmed but not yet graduated from high school. I hope and pray that there are a few good men up for this challenging and rewarding ministry. God bless.

ALL LITURGICAL MINISTERS - Security, Greeters, Ushers, Readers, Extraordinary Ministers of Holy Communion, Altar Servers, Cantors, etc. – When ministering to others, Liturgical Ministers are the face of Christ for the assembly. The image we project reflects not only the dignity of the ministerial role, but our own personal dignity as well. Dress should express respect and reverence for the sacred mysteries that are being celebrated. It should never draw attention. All Liturgical Ministers should wear professional (no less than business casual) and modest attire. Women's Basics: Dress slacks or skirts / dresses which are no more three inches above the knee. Blouses, sweaters, or tops which are not halter, tube, low-cut, or with spaghetti straps. Men's Basics: Dress slacks and collared shirt and / or sweater, suit or suit jacket and tie are optional, but encouraged. Examples of Inappropriate Attire Include Jeans, shorts, t-shirts, flip flops, off-the-shoulder necklines, athletic clothing, clothing revealing midriff or back, or that is too revealing or tight, shirts or blouses with pictures, advertisements or political statements, etc.

Todos Los Ministros Litúrgicos—(Seguridad, Recepcionistas, Ujieres, Lectores, Ministros Extraordinarios de la Sagrada Comunión, Monaguillos, Cantores, etc.) Al ministrar a otros, los Ministros Litúrgicos son el rostro de Cristo para la asamblea. La imagen que proyectamos refleja no solo la dignidad del rol ministerial, sino también nuestra propia dignidad personal. La vestimenta debe expresar respeto y reverencia por los sagrados misterios que se celebran. Nunca debe llamar la atención. Todos los Ministros Litúrgicos deben usar atuendo profesional (no menos que informal de negocios) y modesto. Básicos para Mujeres: Pantalones de vestir o faldas/vestidos que no superen los tres pulgadas por encima de la rodilla. Blusas, suéteres o tops que no sean halter, tubo, escotados o con tirantes finos. Básicos para Hombres: Pantalones de vestir y camisa con cuello y/o suéter, traje o chaqueta de traje y corbata son opcionales, pero se recomiendan. Ejemplos de vestimenta inapropiada incluyen jeans, pantalones cortos, camisetas, chanclas, escotes con hombros descubiertos, ropa deportiva, ropa que revele el abdomen o la espalda o que sea demasiado reveladora o ajustada, camisas o blusas con imágenes, anuncios o declaraciones políticas, etc.

SAINT JOSEPH PARISH ENGLISH WOMEN'S GROUP – Father Riley will be in attendance at the meeting on Monday, 7 July, at 6:30PM. We will meet in the Parish Office Building, enter through the main door between 6:20 & 6:30PM, to prayerfully further discern the purpose and future direction of this group. All active women parishioners who wish to have input and participation in this group are invited and encouraged to attend.

SOME CONSIDERATIONS FOR MASS ATTENDANCE, MASS ETIQUETTE, IF YOU WILL

- 1. It is required that one fasts from food and drink for at least one hour before receiving Holy Communion. The only exceptions are medicine, water or if someone is ill and needs to eat sooner.
- 2. No food, gum, candy or drink in church. The only exceptions would be milk for infants, and water for those with medical issues that require it.
- 3. Cross yourself with holy water on entering and leaving the church. This is a reminder of our Baptism, which made us members of Christ's Church.
- 4. Dress modestly and appropriately, in a way that gives witness to your faith. As Catholics we believe that we are in the Presence of God in His Holy Temple. One should wear the best clothing that he or she has for the celebration of the Mass. Gymwear, beachwear, shorts, pajamas, revealing clothing, flipflops, etc. are NEVER acceptable in church for Mass (do not pass judgement on others, you take care of yourself and your family). Men are never to wear hats in church; women are permitted to cover their heads, if they so choose. No less than business casual should be considered appropriate dress for Mass; it is the greatest Feast that one can celebrate in this life. Remember the parable of Jesus that the one who was not dressed appropriately for the wedding feast was thrown out of the banquet.
- 5. Show up at least a few minutes early to spend time in prayer. If you can't be on time, please try to sit in the back, or better yet, stand in the vestibule, so as not to disturb others. One should also not be moving around during the Mass unless it is an emergency (not a convenience).
- 6. Cell phones should never be used in Mass for calls, texting or games. The only exceptions are for emergencies or if you are using the phone for reading the lectionary or the said prayers/responses.
- 7. Upon entering and leaving the church, genuflect toward the tabernacle. Christ is present for our sake. By allowing our right knee to touch the floor, we acknowledge He is our Lord and God. If someone is physically unable to genuflect, then a bow is sufficient. *During* Mass, if you pass in front of the altar or tabernacle, bow reverently.0
- 8. Sit quietly while in church. If you must talk do so as quietly and briefly as possible. Remember that your conversation might be disturbing someone who is in prayer.
- 9. Children are a blessing in our community. Every parent knows that sometimes a child is going to have a bad day. Parents with young children should sit on the end of a pew, if possible, for easier exit in case you need to move to the cryroom to help them calm down during a meltdown. There is no reason to be embarrassed about having to quiet your child.
- 10. Respect the worship: stand, kneel, sit with the congregation. It is part of worship. The only exceptions are for the sick, people with knee problems, the aged, and those with infants.
- 11. Bow from the waist toward the Blessed Sacrament as the person in front of you is receiving Holy Communion. Remember that you are before your Lord. Also, bow from the waist during the Creed at the worlds "and by the Holy Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and became man."
- 12. Do not leave early, after the priest, unless there is an urgent issue. Remember that it was Judas the betrayer who left the Last Supper early! We should show respect for God, for the priest, and our fellow worshipers by remaining until Mass is completed. Loud and boisterous talking in church is NEVER permitted, and even after Mass, only necessary quiet whispers should be exchanged out of respect for the holiness of the temple. Hold your conversations outside.
- 13. Pray a thanksgiving after Mass, if possible. It is a way for you to show the Lord that you realize the blessing He has bestowed upon you during Mass.
